### a Note from Victory

The LGBTQ+ community's political participation and power continues to grow. More and more people – particularly young people – are identifying as LGBTQ+. Trans and non-binary people are serving in office like never before. LGBTQ+ elected officials are introducing and passing pro-LGBTQ+ laws to safeguard our community's rights. But despite these inroads, our community continues to face an unprecedented wave of attacks – and it's up to us to ensure our leaders have the support they need to fight back and serve openly.

In 2022, thanks to your support, our work to recruit and train the next wave of LGBTQ+ leaders reached new heights. We supported a record number of LGBTQ+ young people interested in a career in public service through our Victory Congressional Internship. We hosted our signature Candidate & Campaign Trainings and Leadership Summits from coast to coast, from Atlanta all the way to Portland. These trainings are the backbone of the LGBTQ+ political pipeline, ensuring that when LGBTQ+ leaders do decide to run, they have the resources and skills needed to win.

The proof is in the pudding. Robert Garcia became the first LGBTQ+ immigrant ever elected to Congress, Zooey Zephyr became Montana's first trans state lawmaker and Andrew Gray became the first LGBTQ+ man elected to Alaska's state legislature. Each of these champions of equality were all trained by Victory Institute and won their elections last year.

Our Political Appointments Program, which helped the Biden Administration become the most inclusive administration in history, also saw great success. We led a coalition of over 30 partner organizations to place an incredible cohort of political appointees last year, including Ambassador Chantale Wong, who became the first out lesbian and first out LGBTQ+ person of color in U.S. history to be appointed to an ambassador-level position.

We were proud to work in four countries outside of the U.S. last year. In 2023, we will expand into eight countries – the most in our history. We trained 100+ LGBTQ+ leaders in Peru, Brazil, Mexico and Colombia – and are already seeing results. From tripling LGBTQ+ representation in the Colombian Congress to helping elect the first out trans people to the Brazilian Congress, our work continues to create meaningful impact around the globe.

Every LGBTQ+ person called to public service opens hearts and minds and every LGBTQ+ elected official serving proudly is yet another bright beacon of hope for our community. Our historic achievements in building LGBTQ+ political power around the globe would not be possible without you. And while we've come a long way, we are just getting started.

Many of our program alumni join the thousands of out LGBTQ+ elected and appointed officials now serving around the world.

As one of the few global LGBTQ+ organizations advocating for LGBTQ+ political participation, Victory Institute continues to strive for worldwide equality. Thanks to pioneering work such as our Political Appointments Program, our global leadership programs and our ever-expanding research and trainings in the U.S., the LGBTQ+ political pipeline remains strong.

Each year, LGBTQ+ Victory Institute assists hundreds of individuals to pursue their goals of working in government, running for public office or elevating their political careers. Our program alumni make up the thousands of out LGBTQ+ elected and appointed officials currently serving across the globe.

As these leaders work tirelessly to advocate for equality and safeguard LGBTQ+ rights, we continue to strive for equal representation and a seat at the tables of power.

While our community remains underrepresented, out LGBTQ+ elected officials prove time and time again that they are able to mobilize allies, punch way above their weight and change hearts and minds. **This year was no different.** 

### Alumni in Action

Colorado State Representative

Brianna Titone became the first out trans legislator elected to leadership of a major U.S. party when she was selected as Democratic Caucus Chair of the House majority. In the aftermath of the attack on Club Q in Colorado, she was a national voice for trans individuals and exemplified the strength and resilience within our community.

California State Senator Scott Wiener built a multi-state movement of LGBTQ+ legislators, facilitated by LGBTQ+ Victory Institute. Inspired to combat anti-trans healthcare

legislation in multiple states, he worked to create "trans refuge states." Despite facing ongoing anti-LGBTQ attacks for this work, multiple states like New York and California have now successfully passed refuge bills, with more states like Connecticut actively fighting for this legislation.

Crystal Hudson is the Co-Chair of the New York City Council LGBTQ Caucus. They introduced the first major piece of legislation to support the prevention, response and treatment for MPox in one of the nation's most impacted cities, while also working to solve the affordable housing crisis.

San Diego Mayor **Todd Gloria** made addressing homelessness a priority for his administration. He opened five new shelters which focused on seniors and people struggling with mental health and addiction issues.

Carolina Giraldo Botero was elected to Congress in Colombia in 2022.

Before her election, she was a City Councilor in Pereira. She is a leader in environmental and anti-corruption policies. As the first out bisexual member of the Colombian Congress, she led the efforts to create its LGBTQ+ caucus among her colleagues.

Program works with presidential administrations

recruit, train and support future appointees, while
making recommendations and providing résumés to
administration staff. Leading a coalition of 30 partner
organizations, the Political Appointments Program has
placed many notable LGBTQ+ leaders in government
positions. LGBTQ+ Victory Institute has played a direct
role in securing over 45% of LGBTQ+ nominations.

Karine Jean-Pierre became the first Black person and first LGBTQ+ person to serve as White House Press Secretary. As one of the country's most visible LGBTQ+ leaders, she has been a transformational role model for LGBTQ+ people and people of color.

### GLOBAL SUCCESSES OF 2022

**PERU** We created a new mentorship program, selecting nine former training participants and helping them achieve personal goals

tied to political participation and civic engagement.

MEXICO More than 100 LGBTQ+ leaders applied for 50 spots at our LGBTQ+ Leadership Summit in Mexico City. Participants represented every major political party in the

country – building ties across political divides.

**BRAZIL** Of our 63 recent trainees in Brazil, 28 ran for office in 2022.

COLOMBIA After the 2022 election, we trained 15 of the 26 out LGBTQ+ elected officials in the country. The training included information on political innovation, building alliances and advancing a career in party politics.
